What is Stewardship? | In biblical terms, Charles Bugg defines stewardship in the Holman Bible Dictionary as "Utilizing and managing all resources God provides for the glory of God and the betterment of His creation." Christian Stewardship regards the obligation of Christians in managing and utilizing intelligently the gifts that God has given. The Christian steward is not only responsible for the financial blessings provided by God but also the spiritual gifts that are given through the Holy Spirit. God wants human beings to be His stewards in the work of creation, redemption, and sanctification.

Stewards in the Bible | Joseph's story in Genesis is considered one of the best examples of biblical stewardship (Gen. 39). After Joseph was brought to Egypt, the Lord made him a prosperous man. While Joseph was in the house of his Egyptian master, the Bible says, "So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him, and he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had" (Gen. 39:4).Relating to the biblical stewardship definition - "the manager of a household" - it is clear why Joseph is an extraordinary example of what it means to be a good steward.
